10,000 Foot State of Play

HOUSE

- 219-212 with 4 vacancies
 - 8 Reps running for Senate
 - 6 Reps running for Governor
 - 5 Reps retiring
- NRCC Patriots: 19
- DCCC Frontline: 26
- Republicans lost 40 seats in 2018
- Redistricting potential: TX,
 CA, UT, MO, IL, NY, FL, MD

SENATE

- 53-47 with 2 independents
 - 1 Sen running for Governor
 - 7 Sens retiring 3 republican
 and 4 democrats
- Seats to defend in 2026: 22 republican 13 democrat
- Democrats need 4 seats to gain the majority; haven't won more than three seats since 2008



Fiscal Year 2026 Appropriations

HOUSE

- Released: 12 of 12
- Voted out of Committee: 10 along party lines
- Passed on the House floor: 3
- Earmarks: 5,027 for a total of \$8B:
 - \$4.8B or 61%
 - \$3B or 37%

SENATE

- Released: 5 of 12
- Voted out of Committee: 5bipartisan
- Passed on the Senate floor: 0
- Earmarks: 13,997 requests made, final tally TBD
